UNIQUE STUDY EXPERIENCE

Situated minutes from town at the foot of the world-renowned Mount Panorama racing circuit, the Bathurst Campus is set in beautifully landscaped grounds and has the warm atmosphere of a small community.

Home to the latest technology in nursing and technical labs, the campus also boasts a state-of-the-art gymnasium and industry-standard Media Centre with radio broadcasting, television studios and editing suites.

As soon as you step onto Bathurst Campus you will notice the difference. We have a huge array of student, sports and social clubs which guarantee an active social life and the opportunity to make plenty of new friendships.

Bathurst is only 207km from Sydney and has its own appeal with colonial streetscapes and many funky cafes, bars and restaurants as well as a vast array of sporting and social activities to pursue.

LIVING ON CAMPUS

The Bathurst Campus has a variety of student accommodation, housing up to 870 students.

Full board accommodation is available in the traditional Halls of Residence (J10) which houses approximately 576 students in single study-bedrooms with communal facilities and common rooms. Students dine in a central dining room, where breakfasts and dinners are provided Monday-Friday.

Students may also choose self-catered accommodation, which is available in three cottages areas (D4), comprising 284 rooms.

All student rooms have a data point and students have access to telephones.

EATING ON CAMPUS

The variety of food outlets on the Bathurst Campus ensures you'll never go hungry (whether you're a student or campus visitor). Macca's Bistro (K5) opens from 10am-3pm Monday to Friday and offers hot meals, morning/afternoon teas and fresh juices while Macca's On Campus (K5) opens 9.30am-3.30pm Monday to Friday offers sandwiches and hot food. Café Mitchell (J6) is open noon to 2pm Monday to

Friday, offering a buffet of mains and desserts with tea and coffee, and the Student Union have a variety of hot meals, freshly made sandwiches/rolls and take-away food. Snacks are available at the Mini-Mart (G4).

SERVICES AND FACILITIES

The Bathurst Campus has a wide range of services and facilities available, which include:

- Student Services Office (L9) – This office offers a range of services to CSU students including career advice, counselling, chaplaincy, learning and study skills and accommodation advice.
- Medical services – Medical staff and services are available to students at the Campus Nurse (L9).
- Child care facilities - The Mitchell Child Care Centre (J11) offers fully accredited child care facilities for the children of staff and students.
- Banks and bookshops – An ANZ ATM and the University Co-op bookshop are located near the main quadrangle (I8).
- Conference Facilities – Centre for Professional Development (E2) CSU's in-house conference facility, features 32 fully serviced single, double or twin share motel suites with ensuite bathrooms, guest lounges and six meeting rooms.

Sporting facilities – Sport is a central part of uni life. Playing fields for most field sports (D10), basketball (F7) and tennis courts (G7), state-of-the-art gymnasium (E7) which is home to the Western Region Academy of Sport, and a nine-hole golf course (D13) are all located on campus. A great recreation program is also offered with social netball and football, self defence courses and aerobics.

INDIGENOUS EDUCATION CENTRES

CSU has Indigenous Education Centres at the campuses in Albury-Wodonga, Bathurst, Dubbo and Wagga Wagga. Students are enrolled in full-time and part-time modes, and study both on campus and by distance education.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are a huge range of scholarship options to provide financial assistance for people who wish to study through CSU.

Scholarships are awarded across a full range of courses, however some are provided only for nominated courses or for students attending particular campuses. Some specify the scholarship must be awarded to a student in a particular year, but many are available for continuing students.

Scholarship selection is not only based on academic achievement. Other criteria include motivation to succeed, commitment to school, university or community life or residence in a particular area. They may include other criteria set by industry donors. There are also scholarships available for students suffering educational disadvantage.
